Artist Statement

My current work mainly consists of interior figurative scenes and exterior cityscapes, set where I was born and raised, Manhattan's Lower East Side, and Brooklyn. My depictions, of friends and places I am in close, intimate relationships with, are filled with humor and existential longing. This is particularly poignant for me now because I have recently moved to Los Angeles. I am looking back from my new home to my old.

Abraham Cahan, the Belarussian-born Jewish immigrant writer, said, "We will accomplish in the new world one-hundred times more than we could in the old. But you'll not be able to erase the old home from your heart. The heart will be drawn elsewhere. And in your solitude, images will rise up and stare in your faces".

Hemingway, remarking on Miro's masterpiece, The Farm, wrote, "It has in it all that you feel about Spain when you are there and all that you feel when you are away and cannot go there. No one else has been able to paint these two very opposing things."

The deep human tendency to imagine places and people we love but cannot return to feeds the act of painting, where you are trying to expel a nameless energy onto a canvas, in longing. You hope your expressions relate to the universal, though they come from an individual in solitude.

The longing, exteriorizing the unconscious, results in an anxious explosion of beauty that is objective and plastic. I am most interested in color, and formal qualities of painting. Concepts, emotions and meanings follow, through them.

I have a concurrent series of sports paintings. The athlete playing a sport is like the artist making art. Both train exhaustively, then get into the game, or face the canvas, and must execute an instantaneous physical action. Neither can think back to their training and experiences in that instant; but all of it has seeped into the unconscious, and there is a beautiful, joyous spirituality in that.

The artist is concerned with humanity, including the humanity of loss, sorrow, humiliation. Few experience those emotions as clearly as athletes, who err publicly and usually fail or lose in the end of a season. But athletes also make extraordinary plays, pull off amazing victories. During these fleeting successful moments, they experience a rare pure ecstatic glory. Art, too, fleetingly and gloriously reaches, and permanently records, that ecstasy.
